

## MESSAGE FROM OUR CHAIR AND OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

At last year's AGM we presented the outcomes of a strategic planning process that would guide the work of the Board of Directors, employees and volunteers for the next 3 years. This year we have been focussing on processes which will enable us to establish a stronger future for the Foundation.

When the Foundation was created 43 years ago, its mandate was to engage and educate young Canadians about the role and function of the three levels of democratic government in Canada. In keeping with this mandate, our vision is now to empower and equip our delegates to participate in meaningful civic engagement. To this end, our programming is constantly adapting as we strive to motivate young Canadians to action by providing them with tools and platforms where challenges faced in their communities can be shared and where priorities that are relevant and important to them can be discussed and, hopefully, acted upon.

Engaging our alumni is a key component of our strategic plan and is vital to the future of our organization. This year, 20 alumnae and Friends of Forum attended the Women Deliver Conference in Vancouver. Creating impact was our focus and the delegates were mandated to implement community projects which would lead to further empowerment of girls and women across the country. This inaugural initiative engaged our alumnae in a powerful way and we look forward to future opportunities for further meaningful impact.

The Foundation went through a number of changes this past year and we would like to acknowledge the dedicated work of staff and board members who have left or will be leaving us. In April, after nearly 23 years, Val Amigo resigned from his position as Director of Operations. Val played a critical role in the development and success of the organization. He held the Forum for Young Canadians program in high regard and his commitment and dedication were evident to all. Sandra Sawers, our Director of Stakeholder Relations, also left her position earlier this year. Sandra forged relationships with many nonprofits, business leaders and public officials.

As well, five members of our Board will be leaving their positions and we would like to thank the following members for their

valued contribution to the Foundation: John MacLean (9 years), Corey Willard (8 years), Andy Gibbons (3 years), Jillian Stirk (2 years) and Irene D'Entremont (2 (As Executive vears). ## Our new Parliamentary Reception - not just an MP Reception!

Every year, we invite Members of Parliament to our reception to meet constituents who are participating in Forum. This year, we opened the invitation to all Parliamentarians and had great participation from both Senators and Members of Parliament.

We look foward to continuing our partnership with the Senate of Canada. Thank you for attending our receptions and supporting these young Canadian leaders!

#### Extra day, thanks to NRCAN

In partnership with Natural Resources Canada, Session 3 participants attended a full day of programming on *Environment, Energy and the Future of Transportation in Canada*.

Prior to Forum, participants were encouraged to engage in community-based conversations to identify specific concerns in their communities with respect to the environment and sustainable transportation. Identified challenges included the reduction of carbon emissions, protecting river banks and water conditions, sustainibility of waste management, subsidies for electric vehicles, improved bike paths, community gardens and public transportation.

What a great way to create potential community action projects! Types of projects that were discussed include: the installation of charging stations for electric cars at school, further educating the community about the importance of recycling and composting, advocating for pedestrian only paths, more accessible bike paths, green roofs on main streets, and green public transportation.



20 women, 20 communities, 20 projects: 1 experience...

She Moves. Elle, en Mouvement. is a journey of personal and professional growth fueled by empowering leadership experiences that will create meaningful impact in communities across Canada.

**Elevate International** and **Forum for Young Canadians** partnered in early 2019 to unite 20 women delegates to travel across Canada and take part in an important global event - **the Women Deliver 2019 Conference**. Delegates also are engaging in a series of leadership opportunities leading up to, and following, the Women Deliver Conference in Vancouver - June 3-6, 2019.

The purpose of the She Moves project is to unite a group of aspiring young female leaders with other multigenerational stakeholders, to live a once in a lifetime experience and, ultimately, shine as empowered Canadian women! Our 2019 delegation includes **17** Forum for Young Canadians alumnae, ranging from Forum 1981 to 2019!

The 3-part project has the participants meeting 3 times in 2019-2020, with Community Impact Project meetings along the way.



- I. International Women's Day Conference: The first meeting, hosted by Elevate International, took place during the International Women's Day conference in March, 2019. Our delegates actively participated in the 2-day conference and began conceptualizing and shaping their Community Impact Projects.
- 2. Women Deliver Global Conference: Via Rail provided half of our our delegation with a 4-day train journey from Toronto to Vancouver to take part in the Women Deliver 2019 Conference in June 2019. Throughout this
- trip, delegates visited meaningful landmarks such as the Canadian Museum for Human Rights, and worked on their community impact projects in hopes of serving girls and women. The other half of the delegation traveled by plane to Vancouver, thanks to long-time Forum partner Uniglobe CBO.
- **3. 1-Year Milestone:** Our delegation will meet once more in Ottawa in 2020 and will present their Community Impact Projects and impact stories.

#### **WOMEN DELIVER CONFERENCE 2019**

In June 2019, our multi-generational *She Moves* delegation joined a network of over 6,000 world leaders, parliamentarians, royals, private sector executives, civil society leaders, young people, advocates, academics, activists, and journalists from over 160 countries with the common objective to power progress for girls and women everywhere.

Today, Canada is driving change for women. This is a pivotal moment in our history to unite the voices, knowledge and experience of all generations and to maximize our impact for generations to come. It is an even greater moment in history as Canada hosts the
